

PROGRAM CURRICULUM

Year 1 is primarily clinical with the fellow spending the majority of their time in our main clinic, Center for Adolescents and Young Adults (CAYAH), doing their continuity clinic as well as clinics focused on Gender Care, Behavioral Health, Reproductive Health, Transition to Adult Care, CHAMP (Comprehensive Hematologic Assessment of Menstration)
